

Law Day 2024 Essay Contest - "Voices of Democracy" San Bernardino County Superior Court

Eligibility

All students in grades 3-12 or the equivalent, attending public or private school, or are home schooled, within San Bernardino County may enter the essay contest.

Prompt

For nearly 250 years, Americans have expressed their political views and wishes by speaking their minds and voting in elections. In 2024, the United States will hold its 60th presidential election, and Americans will address fundamental questions about democracy and the rule of law.

Write a one to two-page essay on what it means to you to have a voice in democracy.

Rules

- 1. Essays must be a maximum of two pages, typed in Times New Roman, 12-point font, and submitted as PDF or Word files.
- 2. Essays must be original, and the exclusive work of the student entering the contest in idea, design, and execution.
- 3. Essays may not include any copyrighted characters (i.e. comics and/or television characters), photographs, magazine or newspaper illustrations.
- 4. Submissions will not be accepted or eligible if they include any content that contains or appears to contain:
 - Profane, obscene, or inappropriate images or language
 - Any derogatory characterization of any person or group based on age, race, color, gender, gender identity, citizenship, creed, national origin, physical appearance, political affiliation, union membership, etc
 - Any actual or apparent copying or other infringement of another's intellectual property.
- 5. All expenses involved in preparing and submitting an entry are the entrant's responsibility.
- 6. All submissions must include the student's name, grade, age, teacher's name, teacher's email, school name, and school address.
